Bootham School

Bootham School is a traditional English private school in the centre of York. It was started in 1823 by the Society of Friends and to this day it is a Quaker school. It sits just outside the city walls and the spires of the famous York Minster can be seen from the grounds. The school boasts excellent modern teaching and sports facilities and has recently seen a large amount of refurbishment.

Location

York is undoubtedly one of the most beautiful cities in the UK. It is to be found 40km to the east of Leeds and 40km from the east coast of England. The city has a proud Roman and Viking heritage which is still in evidence today. Bootham School is located on Bootham bar which is one of the main arteries into the city centre. The closest airports are Leeds Bradford (50km) and Manchester (150km).
